

"This then is what the ANC is fighting. Their struggle is a truly national one. It is a struggle of the African people, inspired by their own suffering and their own experience. It is a struggle for the right to live. During my lifetime, I have dedicated myself to this struggle of the African people. I have fought against White domination and I have fought against Black domination. I have cherished the ideal of a democratic and free society in which all persons live together in harmony and with equal opportunities. It is an ideal which I hope to live for and to achieve. But if needs be, it is an ideal for which I am prepared to die."

(Rivonia Trial: 20 April 1964)





## The Chicago Committee in Solidarity with Southern Africa (CCISSA)

CCISSA is dedicated to supporting the liberation struggle inside South Africa, and to educating the public about apartheid's effects on the frontline states of Tanzania, Angola, Namibia, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Botswana, Swaziland, Lesotho and Malawi.

This is a critical time in the region's history. The South African government, with the long-awaited release of Nelson Mandela, is on the verge of negotiations with the African National Congress, the Mass Democratic Movement and other organizations. Leaders of the liberation struggle have urged their supporters around the world to intensify the pressure on the apartheid regime. So CCISSA will continue to back economic and other sanctions, until those who have called for them ask for sanctions to be lifted. Through initiatives like the Sister Community Project with the township of Alexandra, CCISSA works to keep the goals of the movement in the public eye.

This year also marks a watershed for Namibia, Africa's last colony. March 21, 1990, marks Namibia Independence Day, ending 75 years of South African rule. Whether or not South Africa will finally end its attempts to destroy the democratically elected governments of Mozambique and Angola remains to be seen. In light of the apartheid regime's history of exacerbating war and poverty in the region, CCISSA will continue to use events such as the June 16, 1990 Soweto Day 10K Walkathon to raise public awareness about the situation in the frontline states.

CCISSA works with a variety of local church, community, labor and solidarity organizations. Speakers and educational materials on southern Africa are available as part of CCISSA's outreach efforts. For all of its work, CCISSA depends on its members' generous contributions of time and resources. Now, more than ever, CCISSA needs your support as an active, dues-paying member.
